

UNDERGRADUATE

UNDERGRADUATE-ENGLISH LANGUAGE BRIDGE (ELB) PROGRAM

Students not meeting the undergraduate English language proficiency requirements may begin their university studies through the ELB program. Courses taken in the ELB program count toward an undergraduate degree. The ELB program consists of specialized academic advising, credit-bearing courses designed to improve academic English skills, and other requisite courses standard for an undergraduate student.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL) PROGRAM

Offered through the De La Salle Language Institute, the ESL program is for students who want to improve their English language skills while participating in university life, and potentially pursue a degree following successful completion of the program.
